CIRCULAR TO DEPARTMENTS AND AUTHORITIES NO. 38 OF 2001 DISCRIMINATION AGAINST UNION REPRESENTATIVES

Recently, the Minister of Consumer and Employment Protection has become aware of several allegations of discrimination against employees because of their role as union representatives.

The Government's labour relations policies recognise and support the role of trade unions and the rights of employees to be members, and to represent their colleagues as duly appointed officers or union delegates. Additionally, it is an offence under the Industrial Relations Act 1979 for employees to be treated less favourably because they are members or officers of a union.

Chief Executives should ensure all staff are aware of the Government's policy and the legislative issues surrounding this form of discrimination.
